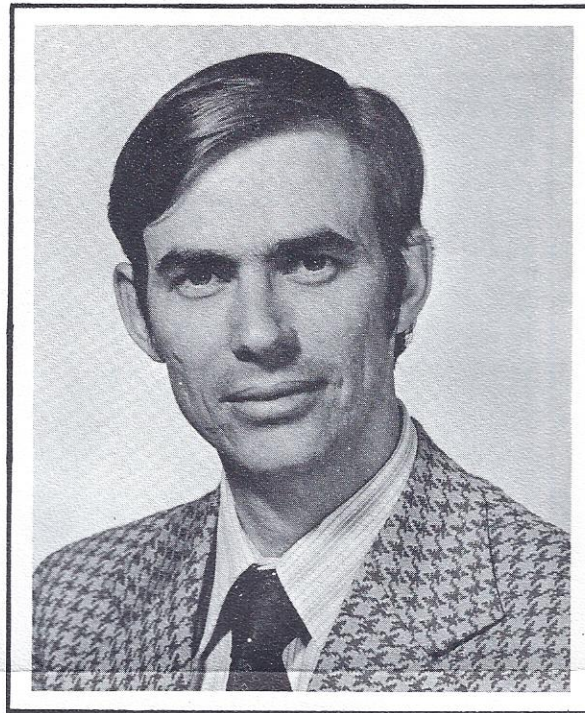

The plant and office will close for vacation Monday, July 8, 1974 and resume operations with beginning of shifts Monday, July 22, 1974.

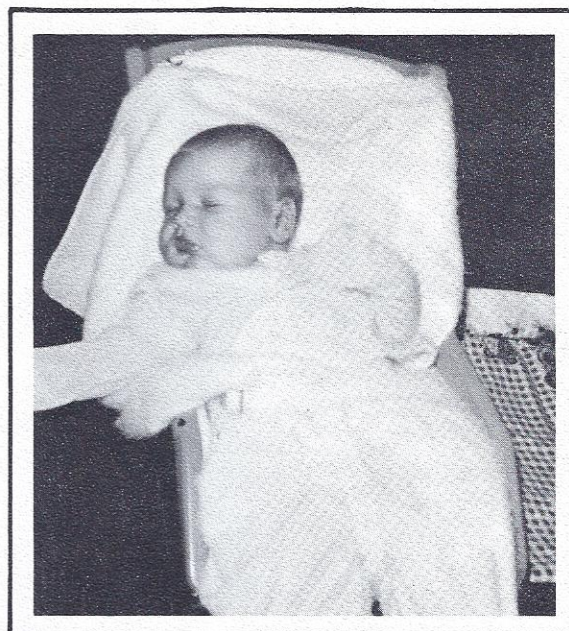
Any employees scheduled to work in the shutdown period will be notified by their supervisor.

LADIES NIGHT OUT-MAY 16TH

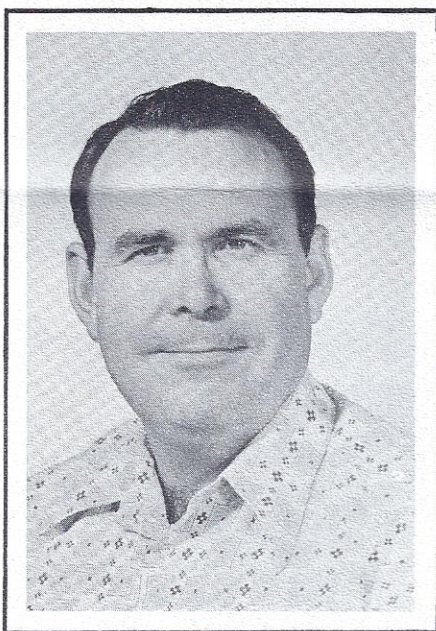

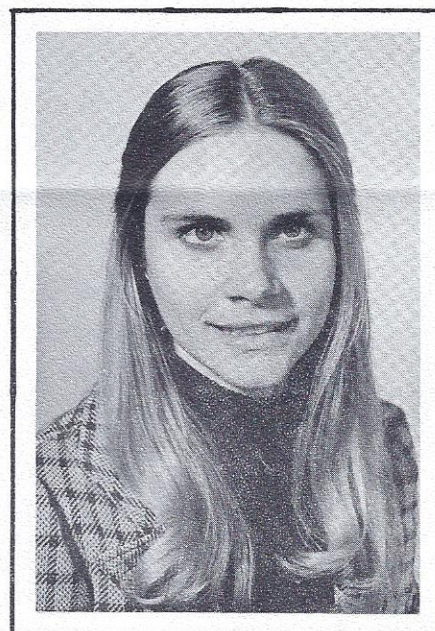

PROMOTIONS...

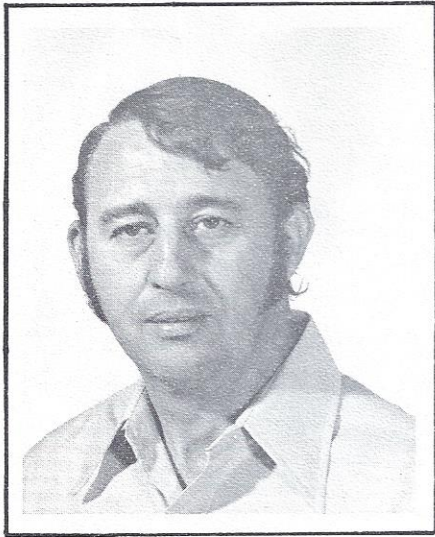

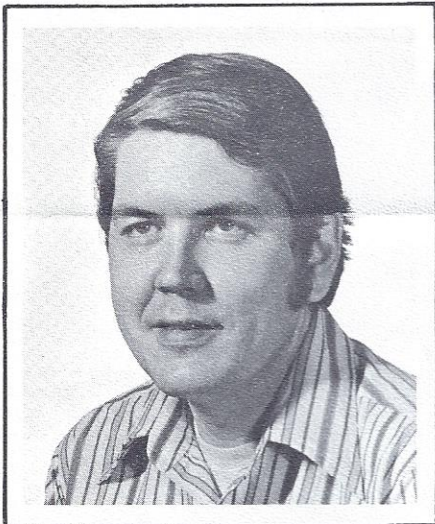

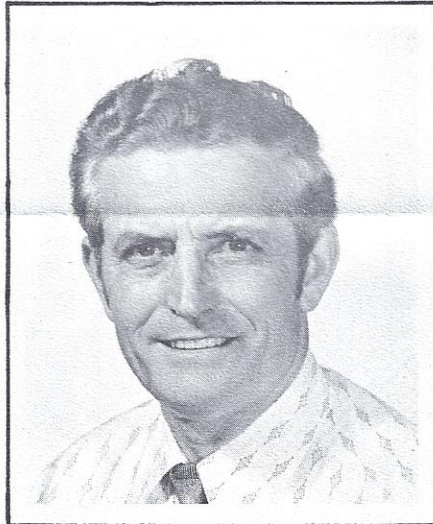
GWYN DEE GAISER

Miss Gwyn Gaiser joined Hahn April 29 in Graphics. She is a 1971 graduate of Central and was formerly with Welborn Hospital.



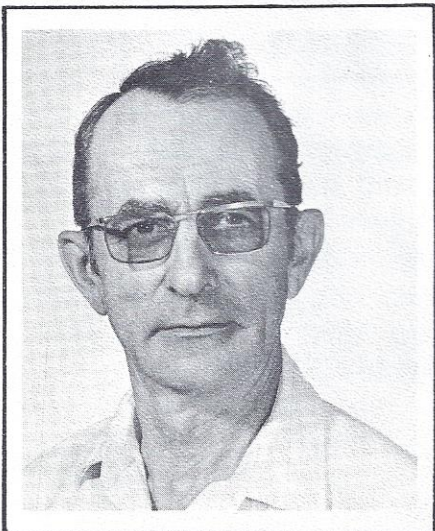

HAHN GOLF LEAGUE

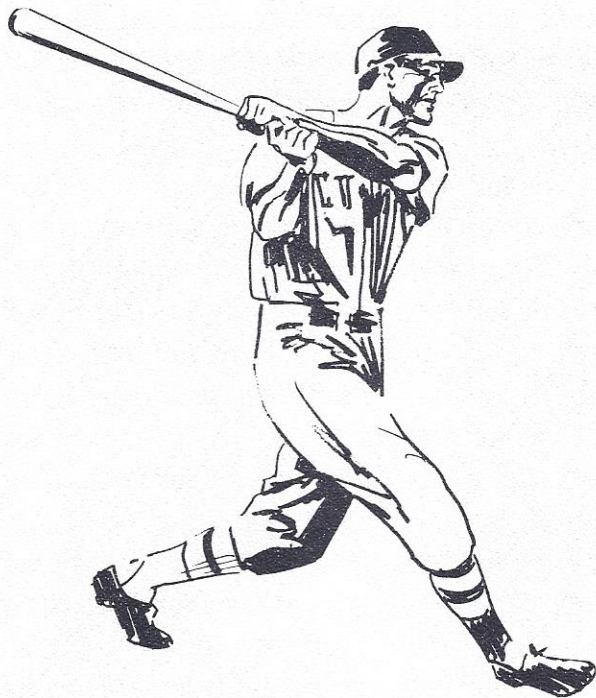

Hahn Employees Coach Local Team to State Basketball Crown...A team of 11, 12 & 13 year old boys coached by Jim Gee and Mike Borst captured Evansville's first Junior AAU Basketball Tournament Championship. The team scored a 62 to 31 victory over an Indianapolis team to advance into the semi-final round. The local boys won the semi-final round by forfeiture and moved into the Championship game against a towering Franklin, IN ball club.

The Franklin team found guards D. Elsner and D. Mattingly more than they could handle and only scored 35 points to Evansville's 67 points. D. CANCER!!!

Cancer can be cured if discovered early enough. It doesn't directly kill normal cells but instead, crowds them out, killing the normal cells indirectly. The cause of cancer is unknown.
