RALPH JOURDAN, pictured above, received the award for being the top volume Regional Sales Manager in the Ag Division of the year.

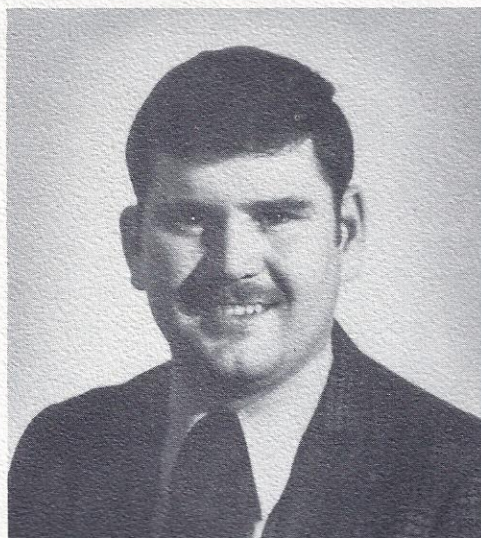
ALLAN WATTS, received the award for having the highest percentage increase in sales volume for the year.

Familiar Faces in new places



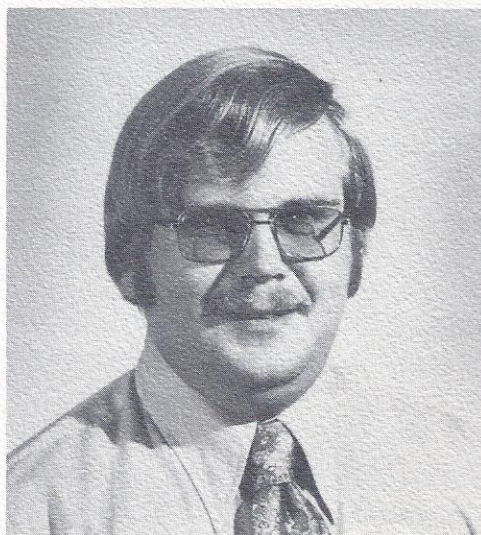

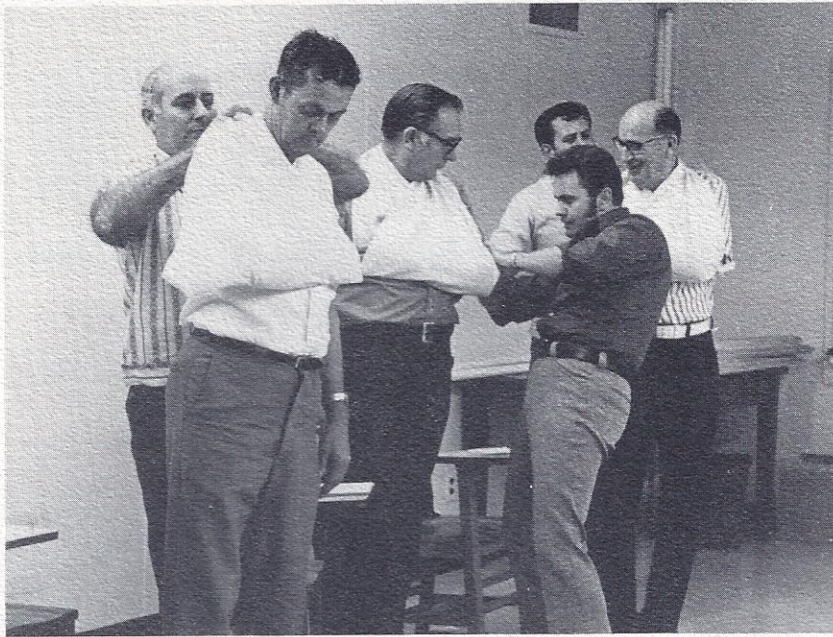
